Did You Know?

Lithium ion batteries should not be thrown in the trash. Lithium ion batteries have a high energy density and can potentially explode, burn, and/or vent toxic fumes when damaged during the disposal process. Pictures of a tablet which caught fire are included.



Please recycle ALL batteries at the landfill or local scrap metal recyclers. Local retailers may also recycle batteries from the products they sell.

The landfill recycles any type of battery, used electronics (except TVs), used motor oil, and used antifreeze.



Other **household** generated wastes or chemicals can also present hazards during disposal. Each fall, the Augusta Regional Landfill typically holds a household hazardous waste clean-up day to accept certain hazardous materials. The event is open to residents of Augusta County, Staunton, and Waynesboro. Hazardous materials from businesses will not be accepted at this event.
