It will be the responsibility of the bidder to see that their bid is in this office by the specified time and date. There will be no exceptions. Date of postmark will not be considered. Local Verizon time will determine the time of day.
- Where appropriate, prices should be stated in linear feet inclusive of all costs. The prices submitted by the Bidder shall include all costs of permits, labor, equipment and materials for the various bid items necessary for furnishing and installing, complete in place, the waterline upgrade in accordance with the below specifications. All items of work not specifically mentioned herein which are required, by the Bidder, to make the product perform as intended and deliver the final product as specified herein shall be included in the respective unit prices bid.
- The terms for payment shall be stated in days and reflect any percentage discount for early payment.
- All Bids must include the company name and be signed by a responsible officer or employee. Obligations assumed by such signatory must be fulfilled.
- Successful Bidder(s) must be properly licensed to provide and deliver their product in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- The Bidder shall comply with all laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and lawful orders of any public authority bearing on the performance of the work and shall give all notices required thereby.
- The Bidder shall assure that all tradesmen who perform work on the project are properly licensed by the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation as required by the Code of Virginia and applicable regulations.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. PRECEDENCE OF TERMS:** In the event there is a conflict between the general terms and conditions and any special terms and conditions which may be included in this solicitation, the special terms and conditions shall apply.
- 2. CLARIFICATION OF TERMS:** If any prospective Bidder has questions about the specifications or other solicitation documents, the prospective Bidder should contact the Technical person whose name appears on the first page of the Invitation to Bid. Any revisions to the solicitation will be made only by addendum, issued by OWNER.
- 3. ADDENDA:** In the event there are any addenda, they will be posted to the OWNER's website at www.acsawater.com/bids. It is the Bidder's responsibility to check the website prior to the submittal deadline to ensure that the Bidder has a complete, up-to-date package.
- 4. PAYMENT TERMS:** Payments will be made upon verification of successful installation. All pay requests and supporting documentation must be approved by OWNER and will be submitted for payment in accordance with OWNER's payment policies. Approvals for payment under this procurement will be by the OWNER's designated technical representative, or their designee, as noted on Page 1 of this solicitation. Final payment may be held until record drawings are received.
- 5. QUALIFICATIONS OF BIDDERS:** OWNER may make such reasonable investigations as deemed proper and necessary to determine the ability of the Bidder to perform the work and the Bidder shall furnish to OWNER all such information and data for this purpose as may be requested. OWNER reserves the right to inspect Bidder's physical facilities prior to award to satisfy questions regarding the Bidder's capabilities. OWNER further reserves the right to reject any proposal if the evidence submitted by, or investigations of, such Bidder fails to satisfy OWNER that such Bidder is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the contract and to complete the work/furnish the item(s) contemplated therein.
- 6. ASSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT:** A contract shall not be assignable by the Bidder in whole or in part without the written consent of OWNER.
- 7. ANTI-DISCRIMINATION:** By submitting their proposals, all Bidders certify to OWNER that they will conform to the provisions of the Presidential Order #11246, the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, as well as the Virginia Fair Employment Act of 1975, as amended, where applicable, and Section 2.2-4311 of the Virginia Public Procurement Act and that during the performance of this contract, the Bidder agrees as follows:

The Bidder will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, or any other basis prohibited by the state law relating to discrimination in employment, except when there is bona fide occupational qualification reasonably necessary to the normal operation of the Bidder. The Bidder agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

Notices, advertisements and solicitations placed by or on behalf of the Bidder will state that such contractor is an equal opportunity employer.

Notices, advertisements and solicitations placed in accordance with federal law, rule or regulation shall be deemed sufficient for the purpose of meeting the requirements of this section.

The Bidder will include the provisions of the foregoing paragraphs in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.

- 8. NONDISCRIMINATION AGAINST FAITH-BASED ORGANIZATION:** In accordance with the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, P.L. 104-193, the OWNER will not discriminate against faith-based organizations. The bidder also agrees to abide by § 2.2-4343.1 of the Virginia Public Procurement Act.
- 9. MINORITY AND WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESSES:** In accordance with Presidential Executive Orders #12138 & #11625 OWNER actively solicits both minority and women-owned businesses to respond to all Invitations to Bid and Requests for Proposal, and if not already on the Authority's mailing list, you may request application for inclusion on the list. Should you be interested, please contact the Authority at (540) 245-5670 and request information.

Disadvantaged business enterprises (DBE), as defined in 49 CFR 23, shall have equal opportunity to compete for and perform subcontracts which the contractor enters into pursuant to this contract. The contractor will use his best efforts to solicit bids from and to utilize DBE subcontractors or subcontractors with meaningful minority group and female representation among their employees.

- 10. DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE:** During the performance of this contract, the Bidder agrees to (i) provide a drug-free workplace for the Bidder's employees; (ii) post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance or marijuana is prohibited in the contractor's workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violation of such prohibition; (iii) state in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Bidder that the Bidder maintains a drug-free workplace; and (iv) include the provisions of the foregoing clauses in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.

For the purposes of this section, "*drug-free workplace*" means a site for the performance of work done in connection with a specific contract awarded to a Bidder in accordance with this chapter, the employees of whom are prohibited from engaging in the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of any controlled substance or marijuana during the performance of the contract.

- 11. ETHICS IN PUBLIC CONTRACTING:** By submitting their proposals, all Bidders certify that their proposals are made without collusion or fraud and that they have not offered or received any kickbacks or inducements from any other Bidder, supplier, manufacturer or subcontractor in connection with their proposal.
- 12. DEBARMENT:** By submitting a proposal the Bidder certifies that neither it (nor he or she) nor any person or firm which has an interest in the Bidder's firm is disbarred or suspended from bidding or working on a state or federally funded project. No part of this contract will be subcontracted to any person or firm who has been debarred or suspended from bidding or working on a state or federally funded project.
- 13. PUBLIC INSPECTION OF PROCUREMENT RECORDS:** Proposals submitted shall be subject to public inspection only in accordance with Virginia Code § 2.2-4342.
- 14. COSTS OF PROPOSAL PREPARATION:** Any costs incurred by the Bidders in preparing or submitting proposals are the Bidders' responsibility. OWNER will not reimburse any Bidder for any costs incurred as a result of a response to this Invitation to Bid.
- 15. OWNERSHIP OF MATERIAL:** Ownership of all data, material and documentation originated and prepared for OWNER, including any electronic media, shall belong exclusively to OWNER and be subject to public inspection in accordance with the Virginia Freedom of Information Act. Trade secrets or proprietary information submitted by a Bidder shall not be subject to public disclosure under the Virginia Freedom of Information Act; however, the Bidder must invoke the protection of this section prior to, or upon submission of, the data or other materials, and must identify the data or other materials to be protected and state the reasons why protection is necessary to the extent that such protected material is separately packaged and so identified in the Bid Submittal envelope.

16. CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT: Unless otherwise specified in the ITB, the OWNER may terminate the resulting contract for its convenience upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Bidder. The Bidder shall not be paid for any service rendered or expense incurred after receipt of such notice except such fees and expenses incurred prior to the effective date of termination that are necessary for curtailment of the Bidder's work under this contract.

17. INSURANCE COVERAGE: Unless otherwise specified in the ITB, the Bidder shall maintain the following insurance to protect it from claims under the Workmen's Compensation Act, and from any other claims for personal injury, including death, and for damage to property that may arise from operations under the Contract, whether such operations be by itself or by any subcontractor, or anyone directly or indirectly employed by either of them.

The Bidder shall purchase and/or maintain insurance coverage on his tools, equipment and machinery and shall waive subrogation to the OWNER for damage thereto.

The OWNER reserves the right to require insurance of any Bidder in greater amounts provided notice of such requirements is stated in the Solicitation.

18. OBLIGATION OF BIDDER: By submitting a proposal, the Bidder covenants and agrees that he has satisfied himself, from his own investigation of the conditions to be met, that he fully understands his obligation and that he will not make any claim for, or have right to cancellation or relief from the contract because of any misunderstanding or lack of information.

19. UNAUTHORIZED ALIENS: In accordance with Virginia Code § 2.2-4311.1. Compliance with federal, state, and local laws and federal immigration law requires that the contractor does not, and shall not during the performance of any awarded contract, knowingly employ an unauthorized alien as defined in the federal Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986.

SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- A. AWARD:** OWNER reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive informalities in any bid. Award will be made to the lowest responsive and responsible Bidder.
- B. AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS:** It is understood and agreed between the parties herein that OWNER shall be bound hereunder only to the extent of the funds available or which may hereafter become available for the purpose of this agreement. Unless canceled or rejected, a responsive bid from the lowest responsible bidder shall be accepted as submitted, except that, if the bid from the lowest responsible bidder exceeds available funds, the OWNER may negotiate with the apparent low bidder to obtain a contract price within available funds in accordance with Terms and Conditions, Item H, below.
- C. BID BOND:** Each bid in excess of \$100,000 shall be accompanied by a bid bond or guarantee of five percent (5%) of the amount of the bid, which shall be a certified check, cash escrow or a bid bond payable to OWNER. The sureties of all bonds shall be from a surety company or companies as are approved by OWNER and are authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth of Virginia. Such bid bond or check shall be submitted with the understanding that it shall guarantee that the Bidder will not withdraw such bid during the period of 60 days following the opening of bids; that if such bid is accepted, the bidder will accept and perform under the terms of the Invitation to Bid and purchase order or contract. The bid guarantee will be returned upon award of contract.
- D. ESCROW:** In accordance with Virginia Code §2.2-4334, for bids of \$200,000 or more for construction of highways, roads, streets, bridges, parking lots, demolition, clearing, grading, excavating, paving, pile driving, miscellaneous drainage structures, and the installation of water, gas, sewer lines and pumping stations, the Bid Form will include a space for the bidder to indicate an option to use the escrow account procedure in order to have retained funds paid to an escrow agent.
- E. PERFORMANCE & PAYMENT BONDS:** The Bidder agrees that upon written notice of an award of the contract, that they shall execute the contract in the form stipulated in accordance with this bid, and shall provide a Performance Bond and Payment Bond with good and sufficient surety or sureties, as required by the contract documents, at the time the contract is executed.
- F. BID ACCEPTANCE PERIOD:** Any bid in response to this solicitation shall be valid for (60) days. At the end of (60) days the bid may be withdrawn at the written request of the bidder. If the bid is not withdrawn at that time it remains in effect until an award is made or the solicitation is canceled.
- G. EXTRA CHARGES NOT ALLOWED:** By submitting their (bids/proposals), all Bidders certify and warrant that the price offered for *F.O.B. destination* includes only the actual freight rate costs at the lowest and best rate and is based upon the actual weight of the goods to be shipped. Except as otherwise specified herein, standard commercial packaging, packing and shipping containers shall be used. All shipping containers shall be legibly marked or labeled on the outside with purchase order number, commodity description, and quantity.
- H. NEGOTIATION WITH THE LOWEST BIDDER:** Unless all bids are cancelled or rejected, OWNER reserves the right granted by § 2.2-4318 of the *Code of Virginia* to negotiate with the lowest responsive, responsible bidder to obtain a contract price within the funds available to the OWNER whenever such low bid exceeds OWNER's available funds. For the purpose of determining when such negotiations may take place, the term "available funds" shall mean those funds which were budgeted by OWNER for this contract prior to the issuance of the written Invitation to Bid. Negotiations with the low bidder may include both modifications of the bid price and other items required to be performed. The OWNER shall initiate such negotiations by written notice to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder that its bid exceeds the available funds and that the OWNER wishes to negotiate a lower contract price. The times, places, and manner of negotiating shall be agreed to by OWNER and the lowest responsive, responsible bidder(s).

ATTACHMENT A

SCOPE OF WORK

1. **Furnish all labor, materials, equipment, permits, traffic control, and supervision necessary for the installation of 2,952 linear feet of 12" water main** along Rt. 11 in Jolivue utilizing the open trench method in accordance with ACSA standards and plans and VDOT Regulations.
 - A) OWNER will furnish all main line pipe, main line fittings, hydrants, and meters.
 - B) The Bidder will furnish all material necessary to complete the job; the materials must be on the ACSA approved product list. **These materials are to include but not be limited to, materials necessary to backfill, perform pressure tests, perform bacteriological tests, install water connections from main to the customer's service lateral, which includes a new meter box and all fittings in the box, gravel restoration, paving restoration, and yard restoration.** All work is located in Jolivue, VA. The Bidder shall adhere to all requirements specified in the following attachments.
 - C) The OWNER has a material and equipment laydown yard. The Bidder will have a designated area where all materials and equipment can be stored. The address for this laydown yard is 28 International Lane, Staunton.
 - D) ACSA crews have been working in the area and have encountered intermittent rock. All pricing will include rock removal. The soil type will be considered as un-classified.
2. All work must be in accordance with the current Augusta County Service Authority "Design and Construction Standards" and plans titled "Jolivue Water Line Improvements" dated April 20th, 2018. The alignment of the waterline shown in these plans is a general guideline. Shifting the proposed line to avoid other utilities and unnecessary fittings is suggested with prior approval by the Director of Field Operations. The waterline must remain within the existing easement areas acquired by the OWNER for this project.
3. All work will be in compliance with VDOT standards for Traffic Control. The Bidder will submit its own permit and Maintenance of Traffic plan to VDOT.
4. Work for this project will be from station 61+61.47 to station 32+10.10. The jack and bore crossings for International Lane (49+55.23) and Christians Creek Road (42+09.02) are not included in this scope of work. The OWNER will have already completed the tie-in work at station 61+61.47 and station 32+10.10. The Bidder will need to start at the newly installed valves.
5. Property owner comments are provided. Any additional requests will be coordinated by ACSA personnel.
6. All trenches in pavement must be temporarily capped off with 2" of cold patch mix after the trench has been properly backfilled and compacted. The cold patch must be applied within 24 hours of crossing the pavement with the newly installed pipe.
7. All work shall be inspected by ACSA inspectors.
8. The Bidder must be able to mobilize within two months of Notice of Award.
9. The Bidder is expected to work continuously on this project, not including weekends and holidays, from start until finish without any delays except as approved by OWNER. Failure to work continuously without delays except as acceptable to the OWNER can result in loss of compensation at the rate of \$500 per work day until the Bidder resumes work.
10. The contract time for the work to be complete shall be 120 consecutive working days from mobilization.
